Toolkit for World Hand Hygiene Day - 5 May 2019

For Hand Hygiene Day this year, the World Health Organisation (WHO) calls on everyone to be inspired by the global movement to achieve universal health coverage.

Since 5 May is a Sunday this year, it is recommended that organisations choose a day during the week of 6-10 May to celebrate and promote hand hygiene, or celebrate the entire week.
