<p><b>Project presentation</b></p> <p>Amy Rosenfeld from SDHB shared their project, Te ara mārama – a clear path which aims to improve Te whare tapa whā scores for Māori major trauma patients transitioning through their rehabilitation unit.</p>	1. Amy to share slides

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Next learning session is due in October June. This programme will largely be workshop based, to encourage teams to collaborate and share their progress with one another.</li> <li>- Webinars are run in between the learning sessions to support teams' work/learnings, with four webinars held to date. Next webinar is September 15.</li> <li>- The collaborative projects have been extended until early 2022 to support team during the Christmas periods in implementing their change ideas, to allow extra time for measurements of change and to ensure the sustainability of projects is embedded into current practice.</li> </ul>
