Professor Clifford Y. Ko
MD, MS, MSHS, FACS, FASCRS

Dr. Clifford Ko is the Director of the Division of Research and Optimal Patient Care at the American College of Surgeons.

He oversees all the quality improvement programs, including the Bariatric Surgery

Accreditation Program, the Cancer Accreditation program, the Trauma Verification program, the new Surgeon Specific Registry, and the American College of Surgeons National Surgical Quality Improvement Program (ACSNSQIP). He also serves as the Director of ACS NSQIP.

Dr. Ko's work focuses on surgical quality of care, including quality measurement, process improvement, and quality maintenance. He has received millions of dollars in grant funding to study quality of care from sources that include the National Institutes of Health, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, the American Cancer Society, the Centers of Medicare and Medicaid Services, the Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality, and the Veterans Administration. He has published over 275 manuscripts and has written more than 20 book chapters.



Professor Guy Ludbrook
MBBS, FANZCA, PhD

Guy Ludbrook is Professor of Anaesthesia at the University of Adelaide and Royal Adelaide Hospital.

He is a practicing anaesthetist, with neuroanaesthesia as a sub-specialty. He is a research pharmacologist, active in pre-clinical and clinical research, with multiple publications in the area and past and current involvement in a large number of clinical trials.

He sits on a number of health-related committees, including ANZCA's Safety and Quality Committee, and currently chairs the TGA's Advisory Committee on Medical Devices.

He has an interest in healthcare delivery, with a past and current involvement in exploring research and innovations in perioperative care, including workforce, and models and systems to identify perioperative risk.
