Prof Keith Harding, MB, ChB, MRCP, FRCP, FRCS is Head of the Department of Dermatology and Wound Healing, School of Medicine, Cardiff University, and Clinical Director of Wound Healing in the Cardiff & Vale NHS Trust. He was previously a Director of Innovation and Engagement (Third Mission) in the School of Medicine and an Advisor of Tissue Therapies Ltd. Since 1991, Prof Harding has been Director of the Wound Healing Research Unit at the University of Wales, College of Medicine in Cardiff. He is also a Clinical Research Consultant at Cardiff University. Prof Harding is widely published and a prolific presenter at scientific and clinical wound care conferences. He has devised and managed many clinical wound care product trials for large international health care companies.
